For centuries the apostle Paul has been

The context indicates the 1 Corinthians 11a Headcovering is a church meeting observance, like the Lord's Supper church meeting

observance in the same chapter. The Headcovering observance symbolizes the church's submission to God-ordained authority and gender roles, which have a huge impact on families, churches, and society. This booklet is intended to be both practical and polemical; for women, laymen, and theologians; and as a contribution to the battle of loving patriarchy against the increasing egalitarianism in modern societies which does so much harm to women. God uniquely created women for special ministries. These ministries include submission, modesty, quietness, affection, and chastity. Such service is like the precious ointment Mary of Bethany poured on the head and feet of Jesus. Women have performed some of the greatest spiritual works of all time.

I also try to interpret the Bible according to "the law of kindness," Prov. 31:26.

Should women teach men? Should they exercise authority over men? What about ordaining women? Even those who agree that Scripture must determine our answers do not agree on what it teaches.
