Added to this is Shetland's better known claim to fame for its spectacular seabird colonies ; huge gannetries, moorland packed with arctic and

great skuas, arctic terns in the more sheltered spots, and everyone's favourite – the puffins. The islands also enjoy a dense population of otters, many seals, and a chance to see killer whales or other giants of the deep. Beyond all this natural grandeur, Shetland's history is fascinating too. The archaeological attractions are much less known than those on Orkney, but sites such as Jarlshof have
