They won three Grammys for their recordings, while sharing their distinctive sound with such notable figures as Glenn Gould, Aaron Copland, Leonard Bernstein, and even Albert Einstein. Together they offer an engrossing glimpse into a life filled with musical milestones and into the fascinating mind of a musical giant.
