Basic Instruction for Hooking Rugs Put your pattern onto an embroidery physique or quilting hoop. It has to lie flat and be tight as a drum. As you hook, retain your burlap tight on your physique as this makes the hooking fantastically a bit easier. Your wool ought to be user-friendly and prepared to use. You can limit it to one-quarter to one-half-inch strips. A accessible strategy for slicing wool is to take an eight-by-four inch rectangle of wool cloth, fold it accordion-style, and limit it into strips. This saves a lot of time and works pleasant with five-and-a-half-inch scis
